KINDERGARTEN AND FIRST GRADE ELIGIBILITY

Students entering kindergarten must be five years of age by September 1st of the year in which they begin kindergarten. In exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case and space-available basis, the Superintendent may approve the entry into kindergarten of students who are five years of age by December 1st of the year in which they begin kindergarten. Factors to be considered in making such a decision include, but are not limited to, literacy, mathematics, language, social/emotional, and fine and gross motor development. Requests for early entrance must be received by June 1st.

Students entering first grade must be six years of age by September 1st of the year in which they begin first grade. Exceptions to this policy may be granted by the Superintendent when (1) written requests are accompanied by evidence of success in a full-year, Rhode Island Department of Education-approved kindergarten program, (2) a student will be six years of age by December 1st of the year in which they enter grade one, and (3) space is available. Students who successfully complete the Chariho kindergarten program are guaranteed entry into a Chariho grade one classroom.
