The Ocean State Automotive Technology Competition was held at New England Tech and was set up in a similar way to SkillsUSA, with 9-10 stations with "bugged" vehicles to diagnose, electrical parts to identify, brake line fittings to flare, computer scan tools to operate, antilock brake waveforms to read, and more. Each Automotive program in the state competed, and the amount of students that could be entered was based on the numbers of instructors the students had. If there was one instructor, two students could be entered. If there were two, four students could be entered. Many programs in the state were able to submit four students. Ryan Pater and Harrison Chagnon's team came in first place, and each won a year's tuition to New England Institute of Technology, some high quality Snap-On tools, and a wild round of applause and awe from the scoring judges. Harrison's score on the written test was one of the highest scores they had ever seen. From here, they compete on the National level in New York against winners from other states in April.

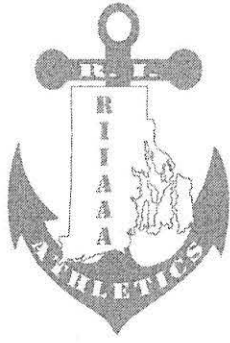
Attached is a picture I received yesterday from one of the judges of Ryan and Harrison using precision measuring tools to check engine block flatness.
