I. Meeting Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance/Moment of Silence

Chair Lisa Macaruso called the meeting of the RYSE School Building Committee, which began in the Middle School foyer, to order at 5:00 PM.

II. Tour of Chariho Alternative Learning Academy

RYSE School Staff joined the Building Committee on a tour of the construction site. All were pleased and excited about the progress that has been made.

III. Meeting Reconvened at Chariho Administration Building/Pledge of Allegiance/Moment of Silence Chair Macaruso reconvened the meeting in the Administration Building Conference Room at 5:36 PM. The Pledge of Allegiance was followed by a moment of silence.

IV. Approval of Minutes of December 18, 2017

Craig Louzon made a motion, seconded Etta Zasloff and it was

VOTED: To approve the minutes of December 18, 2017. In favor: Callahan, Dobson, Louzon, Loeckler, Day, Glass, Zasloff and Macaruso. Abstained: Wright. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor with 1 abstention (Davis and Nelson were not in attendance for the vote).

V. Bill Review

Craig Louzon made a motion, seconded by Etta Zasloff and it was

VOTED: To accept the Bill Review. In favor: Unanimous.

VI. Architect's Report

- 1. Construction Meeting Report Dan Daisy provided an update on the progress of the building. He noted this is a short report as Ahlborg is right where they need to be. There has been no down time and the only change order is the one for the solar array which was approved by the Committee. There was a bit of a scare with brick that was backordered but they were able to find an alternate that was similar to the proposed brick. Craig thanked Bill Day for always attending the meetings on behalf of the Committee.
- 2. Value Engineering Dan stated that he did not believe there were any updates as the Committee has addressed all the items on the list. The Superintendent questioned if there was a change to item #48 to which Dan replied that Lee said National Grid gave the Superintendent the number and this number was part of the campus-wide retrofit. The Superintendent noted that the information that was given was incorrect. Jerry Drummond was helping with the paperwork so that it would not end up costing the District 15%; this is not part of the campus plan. He will discuss this with Lee (who was not in attendance at this time). Craig clarified that the Committee still has a goal of reaching \$40,745 to which the Superintendent confirmed the number. Bruce asked about the solar. Dan replied that the change order was issued to Ahlborg as approved and the contractor is putting together the design. The

design work will be reviewed and they will submit paperwork for the rebate. Sue has been working with Lee gathering electric bills.

3. Design Elements – Matt stated that RGB is going forward with what the Committee selected. Chair Macaruso asked if any decisions were needed this evening to which Matt responded that he did not think so. Barbara questioned the colors in the bathrooms (she missed the last meeting due to illness). Matt noted that Kathy brought samples and the Committee chose a blue/green scheme throughout. Barbara commented on how efficient and smooth the project has evolved. She was very impressed with how the outer elements were pulled together so that the workers could move inside during the winter.

After buttoning up the project site, Glenn and Lee arrived. Chair Macaruso asked if there were any questions for them to which the Committee gave them a round of applause. Glenn and Lee both noted how wonderful it has been working with everyone associated with the project. Chair Macaruso asked when they would need the Building Committee to come together again. Glenn noted that the colors have been selected to which Lee added that he was not sure if what is left would be up to the Architect or the Committee. The Superintendent commented that Kathy stated she needed to return for additional color selections. Etta questioned the wall coverings. It had been decided at the last meeting that they would paint the walls and go with Bill's suggestion to maybe hang some of the student art work. Bruce stated that he would like to see the colors selected for each area on display before they select anything else. The Superintendent replied that this may not be manageable at the next meeting. It will depend on where the project is at that time. Chair Macaruso stated that they could ask Kathy to bring back the samples they have selected.

VII. Next Meeting Date

The next meeting was scheduled for Monday, March 5, 2018 at 5:30 PM in the Administration Building Conference Room.

- I. Call to Order The meeting was called to order by Chair Stanley at 4:05 PM.
- II. Approval of Minutes of October 17, 2017 P. Toth made a motion, seconded by F. Sayer to accept the minutes. Unanimous.
- III. Report from Food Service Director (1) SmarterLunchrooms assessment has been completed in all schools. C. Buxton reported that presentation and product choice was better at upper levels. Fruits and vegetables at Ashaway were beyond reach of younger students. Non-flavored milk should be in front of or side-by-side with white milk in display. Is there a way to more attractively display fruits? S. Buxton will share reports with Health and Wellness Subcommittee; S. Martin will create table of assessment results from all schools and share with Aramark and at next meeting. (2) Food Ambassadors in place at Richmond School. Ambassadors (parent volunteers) have been trained to conduct food tastings in the cafeteria; tastings will be conducted on a monthly basis. Consideration should be given to including 'Food Ambassadors' in the food service budget.
- IV. Goals for 2017-2018 (Staff Wellness, SmarterLunchrooms, Richmond School Pilot) See Item III. The staff wellness initiative was reliant upon the participation of two other districts, but their participation did not materialize.
- V. Adjourn The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 PM.


