December 2020 E-Update



We have fifteen school days until our winter recess. Please note that while in-person registration has closed for Quarter 2/3 and Trimester 2, families who selected in-person learning may opt into full

distance learning during the month of December. Please reach out to your principal if you would like to move to distance learning.

On November 24th the Chariho School Committee met to review our current learning scenarios. Currently, all our schools offer either full in-person learning every day or an option to move to full-time distance learning. We were asked by our school committee to create a plan to have a weekly early release day for students to allow our teachers time in the afternoon to collaborate with colleagues to develop units and lessons that best support our combination of in-person and distance learners.

Therefore, starting next Wednesday the Middle School, High School and CALA will dismiss students at 11:30 am. Our Elementary Schools will dismiss students at 12:45 pm. We recognize any change to our plan is difficult for our families, but we also need to ensure our teachers have the time and resources to provide thoughtful instruction while managing both in-person and distance-learning models. This time will be important for our teachers to sustain productive learning environments for all of our students. <u>We will</u> <u>begin these early release days starting on 12/9/2020 and they will</u> <u>continue every Wednesday moving forward.</u>



## **REQUIRED DAILY SELF-CHECKS**



**Parents and Guardians**: As a reminder, all in-person learners must have a **daily self-check** completed **every day** prior to leaving the house. Any student who participates in athletics, extracurricular activities, or receives services at school will also need the daily self-check completed. This is a requirement from our state as well as part of our **District Attendance Policy**. Any family that does not consistently complete this self-check will be required to move to distance learning. It is imperative that we ensure everyone is healthy when attending school. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated while we work to keep our school communities safe.
