The curricula in Chariho is written by our District Curriculum team and our curricula resources must meet the state requirements. All curricula are then discussed with and approved by the Chariho School Committee during a public meeting. We have a rigorous curriculum vetting process with a five-year cyclic model in place. It is important for our families to know that we firmly believe that every parent has the right to know what curricula are being taught in our classrooms. Our transportation system operates most efficiently when we transport those who need transportation, as opposed to those who are eligible, but may not use it.
