

Chariho Regional School District FY '23 Budget

Top 3 Community Budget Questions

QUESTION 1: The District was allocated \$4.6 Million for ESSER I, II, and III, so why is Chariho's budget not decreasing for FY 23?

ESSER funds are required to meet federal and state requirements. We have prepared a breakdown of the impact to the operating budget by each fiscal year of ESSER funding. QUESTION 2: What are our major increases or decreases in the budget?

To review increases and decreases higher than 10% click **HERE**. Many items that saw decreases were due to our ability to place items like curricular resources and professional development in our ESSER plans. Items that saw increases were often due to inflation (i.e. oil).

QUESTION 3: How has Chariho used ESSER funds and how is Chariho proposing to spend ESSER III funds in FY 23?

ESSER I and II has mainly been used to reduce operating and capital costs, such as mandated curriculum purchases, 1:1 computer updates for all students, transportation costs, Covid response costs, HEPA filters, HVAC improvements. FY23 ESSER III includes the addition of math and support specialists address student's learning loss, as well as mandated curriculum updates (see our budget presentation linked HERE for a detailed breakdown of our ESSER III proposed budget).
