<u>Chariho High School Advanced Placement</u> (AP) Scores Exhibit Excellence

We are proud to acknowledge that Chariho High School's Advanced Placement exam performance was very strong with the majority of AP subject areas outperforming both state and global data. This was seen across both the Humanities and STEM fields. One hundred and eighty-one students took the AP Exams this year, and Chariho High School administered 284 total exams. Seventy-five percent of all Chariho AP students earned a score of 3 ("Qualified") or higher on their AP exam. A score of "3" or "Qualified" means that a student has proven him/herself capable of doing work of an introductory level course in a particular subject area at college. Additionally, thirty-seven Chariho students earned "AP Scholar Awards", this award is given to students who receive a score of 3 or higher on three or more AP exams. Andrea Spas, principal of Chariho High School states, "This is a huge achievement for our students. We are proud to highlight the following accomplishments":

- 1. 89.5% of our **AP Biology** students scored a 3 or better on their AP exam, greatly surpassing the RI data of 62.2% and Global data of 67.9%.
- 2. 95.8% of our **AP Computer Science Principles** students scored a 3 or better on their AP exam, greatly surpassing the RI data of 59.3% and Global data of 63.5%.
- 3. 96.3% of our **AP English Literature** students scored a 3 or better on their AP exam, greatly surpassing the RI data of 78.5% and the Global data of 77.9%.
- 4. 77.8% of our **AP US Government** students scored a 3 or better on their AP exam, greatly surpassing the RI data of 53.4% and the Global data of 48.6%.
- 5. 100% of our **AP Drawing and AP 3D Art** students scored a 3 or better on their AP exam, surpassing both RI and global data!

We are very proud of the hard work of our students and teachers. The outstanding performance on the Advanced Placement exams of our students reflects the high-quality education our students are receiving and we want to congratulate all of them on a job well done.
