lan Clark took first place in both the 100 and the 200 in the Southern Division Track and Field Championship. He was named the Track MVP of the Championship. Ian broke the Class B meet record in the 200 (meet-record time of 22.77); was 1st in the 100 and was part of a record-setting 1st place relay team (meet-record time of 44.55) with Nekoda Thompson, Collin Fitts and Eli Sposato at the Class B Championships. Eli Sposato finished first in the 400 and the high jump at the Southern Division Track and Field Championship and was part of the record-setting 1st place relay team at the Class B Championships. Weeko Thompson took 1st place and improved her school record in discus and also placed 1st in the shot put at the Southern Division Track and Field Championship. She won the shot put and finished second in the discus at the Class B Girls' Track and Field Championship. Erin Von Housen won the 1,500 and improved her record at the Southern Division Track and Field Championship. She finished second in the 3,000 at the Class B Championship.
