CREDIT RECOVERY POLICY

The Chariho Regional School Committee acknowledges the importance of Credit Recovery as a vehicle by which to increase student achievement and encourage students to recover credits lost due to failure. Students are responsible for registering for Credit Recovery with the aid of appropriate personnel.

Chariho Credit Recovery will be offered at the discretion of the Chariho Regional School District.

CHARIHO REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

- A. For students attending Chariho Regional High School who complete a Chariho Credit Recovery course and achieve a failing quarterly grade, final quarterly course grades will be computed by averaging the quarterly grade achieved during the regular school day course with the Credit Recovery quarterly grade.
- B. For those students who are completing *proactive* credit recovery (remediating their grades before course completion), they can earn a maximum score of 70.
- C. Chariho Regional High School students must attend Credit Recovery to recover quarterly course grades at Chariho Regional High School. Students may avail themselves of this opportunity to recover a quarterly course grade for up to one year from the date of the issuance of the failing grade. As an alternative, the services of an approved, certified tutor may be secured at parental expense. The instructional program to be offered by the private tutor must be pre-approved by the principal of Chariho Regional High School.

CHARIHO REGIONAL MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS

- A. For students attending Chariho Regional Middle School, final quarterly grades will be determined by averaging the quarterly grade achieved during the regular school day course with the Credit Recovery quarterly course grade.
- B. Chariho Regional Middle School students must attend Credit Recovery to recover a failing quarterly course grade at Chariho Regional Middle School. Students may avail themselves of this opportunity to recover a quarterly course grade only during the school year (and subsequent summer) during which the quarterly grade was achieved. As an alternative, the services of an approved, certified tutor may be secured at parental expense. The instructional program to be offered by the private tutor must be pre-approved by the principal of Chariho Regional Middle School. All attendance guidelines contained in this policy will apply.
