- > Five or more recent years of English Language Arts or Reading teaching experience and demonstrated leadership. Must be rated "Highly Effective" on most recent evaluation.
- > Thorough knowledge of the Common Core State Standards in English Language Arts and writing standards in the Chariho Regional School District's English Language Arts Curriculum with an emphasis on writing as an integral part of building teacher capacity.
- > A strong foundation of how to deepen content and pedagogical knowledge of staff in the area of writing in English Language Arts and across the curriculum
- > Demonstrated success in planning and delivery of personalized instruction and assessment using technology.
- > Specialized experience or training and expertise in providing professional learning experiences aligned to the Rhode Island Professional Learning Standards to teachers in English Language Arts and writing across the curriculum and content areas.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities (other duties may be assigned)

This position requires strong and successful experience in the knowledge and application of the science of reading and English Language Arts, the use of data and assessments in planning for instruction, and writing across the curriculum with explicit skills and strategies to develop the connection of reading, writing, and knowledge development. The candidate should also have a strong interest in identifying and researching methodologies and professional development experiences and ongoing coaching to assist teachers as they transition to understanding writing as a connection to reading and knowledge development. The qualified candidate for this position will demonstrate leadership skills and a commitment to providing teachers with support and professional learning experiences.

- > Provide direct support to the classroom teacher via coaching or modeling.
- ➤ Provide instructional guidance and resources to support high student achievement.
- > Consult and collaborate directly with teachers and work with students for the purpose of modeling, lesson demonstration, or coaching.
- > Advise and assist teachers in using High Quality Curriculum Materials in lesson design and instructional delivery.
- ➤ Develop and coordinate a comprehensive professional development program, including facilitating publisher-provided professional development or other relevant adult learning experiences related to the adopted High-Quality Curriculum Materials, the RI Right to Read Act, and the Chariho English Language Arts Curriculum.
- > Facilitate professional learning communities at each level (elementary, middle, and high) for

collaborative curriculum planning and discussion of student work, as one form of embedded professional development for teachers.

- > Provide support to building leaders.
- > Serve as an ex-officio member of the District Curriculum Planning Council and District NEA Professional Development Committee.
