Elementary Facility Walks

As our elementary school buildings in Chariho age, our district faces the challenge of determining the best next steps. The School Committee is organizing an opportunity for community members to review our school buildings. Through scheduled Facility Walks, the School Committee welcomes feedback on how community members would like to see the Committee proceed, as it relates to capital improvements.

The district is required by law to implement a 5-year capital improvement plan. That plan focuses on general maintenance, health and safety and will cost approximately \$25,000,000 over the next five years. The capital improvement plan was presented during the school budget workshops as well as during the school committee meeting on April 25, 2023.

The Committee is gathering information to determine if they should explore additional options, such as renovations, new buildings, or focusing specifically on a health and safety plan for each school.

When maintaining a school, we pay not only for bricks and mortar, but also student and staff well-being. Effective school maintenance protects capital investments, ensures the health and safety of our children, and supports educational performance.

Because we know that routine and unexpected maintenance demands are bound to arise, we must proactively develop and implement a plan for dealing with these inevitabilities. Thus, our capital improvement plan must meet the challenges of effective facilities maintenance. Our infrastructure impacts teaching and learning, student and staff health, day-to-day building operations, and the long-range fiscal outlook of the district.

The current age of our Elementary Schools:

Ashaway Elementary School: 56 years (1967 with addition in 1970 and portable) Charlestown Elementary School: 73 years (with additions in 1960 and 1970) Hope Valley Elementary School: 88 years (1955 addition and portable)

Richmond Elementary School: 88 years (additions in 1967, 1980, and 1985)

Erin von Housen finished 1st in the 2,000 Steeplechase in the New York Relays with a time of 7: 10.93 which qualifies her for the Nationals in June. **Jared Peltier** finished in 9th place in the Boys' Invitational in the New York Relays with a time of 7:05.28. As both athletes were the first Chariho competitors at this race, their times have set a school record.

Chaia Elwell scored her 100th goal in High School Girls' Lacrosse and was named The Westerly Sun's Athlete of the Week for the week ending April 22, 2023.

High School sophomore **Brandon Thorpe's** artwork 'Reverence' was chosen as one of two Senator Reed Staff Picks in the 2023 High School Art Competition.

Weeko Thompson won the discus and was second in the shot put at the High School Girls' Track and Field Southern Division Championship.

Eli Sposato placed 1st in the 400 (improving his own school record) and **Ian Clark** placed 1st in the 200 and 2nd in the 100 at the High School Boys' Track and Field Southern Division Championship.

Erin von Housen finished 1st in the 3,000 at the Mariner Invitational Girls' Track and Field Meet (she improved her own school record with a time of 10:23.53 winning the race by almost 23 seconds) and she took 1st place in the 800 at the Class B Meet last Sunday.

Brooke Kanaczet topped the field in the 1,500 at the Mariner Invitational Girls' Track and Field Meet with a time of 4:51.10.

High School Junior **Macey MacLeod** received the 2023 Young Leaders Award from RI General Treasurer James Diossa.

Trey is considered to be one of the top high school welders in the country.
