


# Chariho Regional School District

Improving Student Attendance is a goal for every school in Chariho. RIDE has created a dashboard that is updated daily, helping school leaders to identify attendance issues early and often. We define chronic absence as missing 10 percent or more of the school year. Through this dashboard, you can see the total student enrollment at each school, the number of students on track to be chronically absent, and the percentage of students on track to be chronically absent. Please keep in mind that this captures students who have been absent for 10 percent or more of the school year so far, and numbers will fluctuate throughout the school year. Click here to check back regularly to see how our schools are doing.
