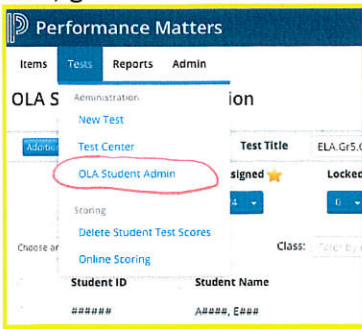


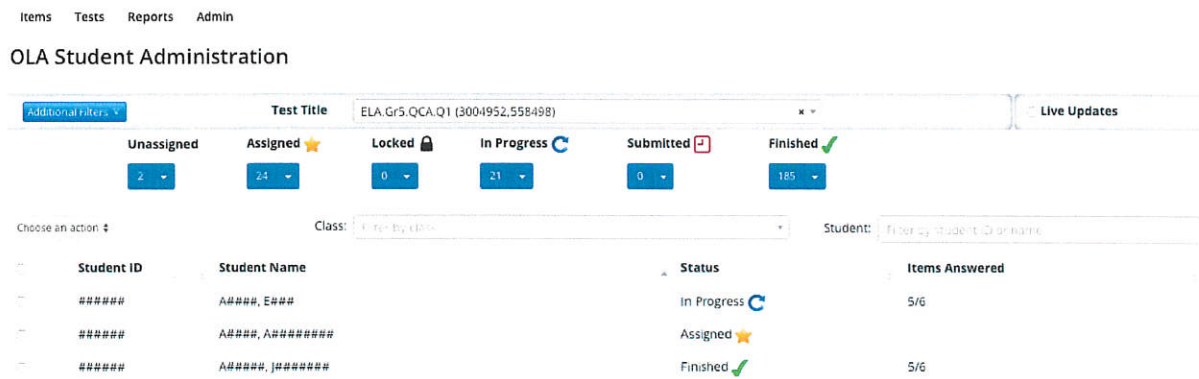
What to do if a student leaves any questions unanswered:

I) During testing:

First, go to "Test" and then click OLA Student Admin.



When on the OLA Student Administration page, look for students who have submitted or finished their test. It will list the number of items answered. If they are not all answered, you could select the student with the checkbox in front of their name, and then "Choose an action", and move the student back to "In Progress", then have the student check their test for any blanks. (For many ELA tests, just a reminder that typically the first item is the passage and not scored anyways)



II) OR.....Once you pull up the Student Item Analysis Report and notice the student has a blank response....
